The teamwork came through early in the first quarter with a strong mark by Spencer Mooney in defence delivered accurately to Callum Lightfoot, who in turn delivered a clearing kick to Mitchell O'Brien. Isaac Males made several great lead outs providing a target for his teammates and taking several great marks. Aidan Kelly withstood strong defence from Eastlake in the forward line to take a good mark.

In the second quarter Ewan Wyles took a good mark in the midfield and the whole team was constantly on the move under pressure from Eastlake. Good combinations of team work in the centre were evident. In the backline, Nick Brito saved a certain goal right on the line, showing good skills to scoop up the ball, avoid his opponent and deliver the ball into the centre where it was marked by Jude Henderson-Burch.

The third quarter was a hard one for the boys with Eastlake upping the pace. Mitchell O'Brien was a sold defender who was always at the ball, teaming up with Jude, Aidan and Nick for a quick succession of kicks. Ioannis Apostolakis contributed with solid tackles, and Sam Dietz and Ned Hibbert showed good teamwork under pressure.

The fourth quarter was by far the best for Marist. The midfield combination worked hard to keep the ball in the centre and back into the forward line for the majority of the quarter. Great offensive teamwork ended with a behind to Ioannis Apostolakis. Jude Henderson-Burch then ran the length of the midfield to deliver a kick to Callum Lightfoot. On a cool and windy day we stepped out for Round 2 with an 'evened up' 16 a side game (numbers knocked around a bit by holidays). The Sky runners continued to reach deep and find an extra effort and James Elwin capped off an all around dominant game with a number of telling runs through the midfield, one of which led to the final match sealing goal to James Surtees. Expectations had obviously been set pretty high from last weekend's cracking demonstration of the modern game. Could the boys do it again? Conditions this Saturday had certainly changed. First, the boys were down two players. Second, a very strong southerly breeze was gusting across the mighty Lindwall Oval. After grabbing (an excellent) coffee from the Marist canteen, the spectators, huddled against the mounting gale, waited anxiously to see what the old foes, Belconnen Cats, could bring to the field. They didn't have to wait long. Marist had the breeze in the first quarter, and using this to their advantage, were immediately on the attack. Three behinds followed in quick succession.

In addition to his weet-bix, Thomas Highmore had obviously swallowed a goodly amount of fire with

his breakfast and opened the goal scoring with a beautifully weighted punt. Thomas was not the only Marist player with a fire in his belly. Chris Williams put his body on the line several times with some great smothering and determined tackling. Marist put on another 5 unanswered goals to lead by the end of the first quarter at 6-9-45 to nil.

The second quarter now meant the Marist team were kicking into the wind. Despite this, the boys were still able to add to the tally with an additional two goals. Liam Tutty took some great marks and was backed up repeatedly by Dean Simpson with gutsy and determined tackling. Pushing into the wind, the boys took their coaches advice, attempting to keep the play away from the central corridor and instead, playing it wide up each wing.

Jack Ellis had another standout game in this regard, who, with multiple other players, showed great running and hand passing skills. The score going into half time was Marist 8-9-57, with the Cats coming back to a creditable 4-1-25.

The lack of an interchange was beginning to tell, and the Marist team knew they had to use the wind in the third quarter in order to get a comfortable lead over their rivals. The boys put on another 4 goals, and despite their fatigue, managed to limit the opposition to only a single goal in the 3rd quarter.

The perfect storm of having no interchange, injured players, as well pushing into the stiffening southerly breeze really began to sort the men out from the boys in the fourth quarter. But the Marist team were up to the challenge. Their presence, confidence and growing maturity enabled them to dictate the game they wanted to play. That meant slowing it down; keeping the ball low; and avoidance of the central corridor. Great running and handballing from Nicholas Cooke characterised this successful style of play, that ultimately led to another comprehensive victory for the Marist Team 15-15-104 to 8-2-50.

Marist U16 Div 1 recorded its first win of the season by comfortably beating the Tuggeranong Hawks by 69 points at a windswept Lindwall. With 8 players unavailable for today's game the team was bolstered by some good inclusions from U16 Div 2 and from the First XVIII. After holding a two-goal lead at the first change, a second quarter blitz in which Marist kicked six goals to the Hawks one opened up a handy lead and the home team was able to run away 18.7 (115) to 7.4 (46).

Playing in front and with greater intensity Marist was able to out muscle its opponents for much of today's game. The high number of Marist individual goal scorers - twelve in total - was a strong indicator of the home team's dominance. Although there were many good contributors in the match several stood out. Mitch Carney was again judged to be best afield with his trademark

breaking of opposition lines and collecting a match high 24 possessions in the process. Meanwhile his midfield deputy, Sam Short, once again attacked the ball like a lifetime of free ice cream was at stake. Pietro Badalassi and Shaun Mills carried on their good work from last week picking up plenty of possession and making good use of it. Jordon Fulton and Jaspar Kidd were never far away from the action and their contribution increased as the match wore on.

The first quarter saw Marist establish a lead the Hawks were never able to seriously threaten. Jordan Fulton opened the goal scoring for the home team following some excellent lead up work from Sean Drummond. Marist didn't always win the taps but the home team consistently beat the Hawks at stoppages with their greater aggressive play and this set a pattern for the rest of the match. Marist

capitalised on their superior possession with four more goals. One each for Hayden Jackson, Pietro Badalassi, Brad Burns and an impressive team goal from Michael Peterson which featured a string of passes from Hayden Jackson and Pietro Badalassi. Mitch Carney topped the disposal count with 7 penetrating kicks into the forward line.

Marist's domination carried over into the second quarter. Sean Drummond was prominent with numerous early touches including a hand in Hayden Jackson's second goal of the match and then contributed a spectacular goal of his own moments later. Cheyenne Bowers added a third for the quarter when he nailed a set shot from about 25 metres and then that man, Hayden Jackson, was at it again, put in the clear for his third goal by a superb handpass from Shaun Mills. The Hawks managed to pull one back late in the quarter but the energised home team seemed unstoppable.

Jack O'Halloran threaded a goal from an acute angle and Michael Pert hit one home for his first of the day. Again the line breaking of Mitch Carney was a feature of the quarter. His runs down the corridor were poetry in motion - like Black Caviar down the Flemington straight but with a whole lot more menace. Also impressive this quarter were Shaun Mills with 2 good marks and 4 disposals, Sean Drummond and Jordan Fulton for their ferocious tackling and commendable unselfish team play by forward Hayden Jackson who on two occasions chose to pass to a better placed team mate rather than just blazing away from difficult angles.

The Hawks made some tactical changes for the second half by moving bigger bodies behind the ball in defence. This paid dividends immediately with Marist forwards now suddenly finding it difficult to get off clear shots at goal. But again it was the home team that opened scoring when Mitch Carney grubbered through a forest of legs to register his first of the day. A tall long haired Hawks forward wearing a head band ala Bruce Doull stepped up next to slot home the visitor's first goal of the second half and this was followed

soon after by another roosted from just inside 50. But the mini Hawks revival was short lived - halted in its tracks by three quick Marist goals - one to Shaun Mills, one to Hayden Jackson from a free kick and a second to Shaun Mills who swung around and connected sweetly from an sharp angle. Highlights for the quarter included a strong pack mark from Mitchell Carney and some inspirational runs out of defence by Pietro Badalassi and Jasper Kidd.

Trent Varlow scored the first goal of the last quarter when spotted successfully by a Michael Peterson pass. Though outplayed for much of the game and mostly outbodied at stoppages, the Hawks played some competitive footy in the final quarter and their efforts were rewarded by an early scrambled goal. But Marist still had all the answers. Michael Peterson on the end of an unselfish pass from Shaun Mills registered his second of the day before the Hawks pulled one back. A titanic struggle followed as the Hawks seemed intent on making the score line more respectable. Finally in the dying moments of the match a long searching Mitch Carney pass found an unmarked Hayden Jackson who was able to run in and score the last of his bag of five. Highlights of the quarter included two inspirational contested marks from Matthew Pert. One of these saw 'Perty', the smallest man on the field, standing his ground and marking in a nest of much bigger Hawks. It only goes to prove that just because you are small in stature doesn't mean you can't have an impact. The other talking point was Mitch Carney's amazing horizontal leap. Was Mitch a soccer goalkeeper in a previous life? His gravity defying aerobatics were reminiscent of the 'double saves' of Jim Montgomery in goal for Sunderland in the unforgettable FA Cup final of 1973.
