PRESIDENT'S REPORT

As the last siren sounds for MAFC in 2016, we can start to relax and reflect on what has been another successful season for our Club. True, there may be no silverware for the cabinet this year but we gave it a crack! We were well represented in the finals with our U11s narrowly losing their Grand Final and our undefeated U15s heartbreakingly losing at the final hurdle in tough conditions. Our Rising stars also narrowly missed an opportunity to defend their title in a last minute one-point loss to the Queanbeyan Tigers.

In 2016, we fielded 231 registered players in ten teams spanning age groups from U10 through to the Rising Stars. This was an increase on numbers from last year as we continue to develop the sport within the College.

The traditions built through our early days have stood the test of time and, as a Club, we have continued to grow and position ourselves as a respected sporting club both within our own Marist Community and also the wider AFL Community.

Every team we field is supported by a minimum of 2 coaches, a manager and a first aid officer, not to mention boundary umpires, goal umpires, runners, ground managers and canteen helpers, to say nothing of the 15 or so committee members who meet monthly to make sure we meet our administrative obligations. This is a huge commitment week in, week out, and with so many of you contributing to the success of our Club; this demonstrates the strength of our MAFC community.

As I watched the U10s and U11s games a few weeks ago, I marveled at just how passionate our players and parents are. I reflected later with parents in the older age groups about how we would stand on the sideline watching our youngest play, thinking life and football could not get much better than that - but there are so many lessons to be learned. As our boys progress through the age groups, the ups and the downs, the good seasons, the great seasons and the not so good seasons, we hope they learn about sportsmanship, mateship and resilience. We want our players to understand what it is to be part of a club and to think outside of teams and individuals and what it is to play with pride for the College.

Indeed, some of those young boys grow up to potential draft picks. Sam Fisher, from last year's First XVIII has recently been invited to attend the AFL Draft Combine. Sam played some of his football with Ainslie Div 1 and NEAFL in his final year but joined the First XVIII in the latter part of the season and was awarded 'Best On Ground' in our Rising Stars premiership win. We will all be watching in anticipation and wish Sam all the very best for the draft combine.

As I reflect on the last 12 months, I cannot stress enough of how proud I am about the sense of community that is always on display – and is the envy of many other clubs. It is great to witness teams hanging around to support and watch other teams and forming guards of honour for the next team to take the field at Lindwall or any other ground where Marist teams play

back-to-back.

At the weekend's finals, we again had the Mari Army led by Zac Cooney. The camaraderie and support from all the boys at the College is something very special and unique to us in the AFL Canberra competition.

As we celebrate our successes, we continue to face challenges. Each year, AFL Canberra reviews their competition structure in an effort to maximise numbers and grow the sport locally. We continue to campaign for a spot in the Rising Stars competition for our Senior Team. We know that the boys aspire to the First XVIII and want to play in a competitive senior competition. Through the hard work of the Committee and supporters, we successfully negotiate to extend our life in the Rising Stars competition year-by-year, but there are no guarantees. We are still waiting to cement our spot for 2017.

We will rally again and we will fight for our boys. Boys want to, and deserve the opportunity to, represent their school at the highest level. The MAFC First XVIII has a proud tradition and together we need to ensure its future.

Everything we do at MAFC, we do in partnership and with the support of the College. In the last 2 years, we have been very fortunate to have Sarah Mahar as our AFL Ambassador at the College. Those who have dealt with Sarah understand that there is no job too big or too small for Sarah. Sarah is a constant support and provides and enormous contribution to the Club. I would also like to acknowledge Paul Mead, the College Sports Master, for his support and guidance.

It was great to see so many of the College staff at games this year. We especially welcomed Mr Sidorko and Mr Greer at finals fixtures in the artic conditions at Amaroo and on Fathers' Day at Queanbeyan.

The next 18 months or so, while construction takes place for the 50th Jubilee building, will be exciting but will provide some challenges and your patience will be required. The end result will be a first class facility with tiered seating, for an even better Lindwall Oval game day experience.

Coaches and Managers

Coaching is such an important job and we are lucky to have at least two coaches for every team we field. Thanks to the efforts of Leo Quirk, our 2016 Coaching Coordinator, we have a network of coaches who regularly come together in a community of practice to share and learn from each other and to hear from guest speakers. This contributes to the overall professionalism of the Club and enhances the development of our players. Coaching is a huge commitment and I am very grateful for the time dedicated by these volunteers – some of whom do not even have boys playing in the team they coach. I would like to make special mention of a couple of coaches. Firstly, to Mark Henderson who won the AFL Canberra Junior Coach of the Year and also to Paul Highmore who was named the Damian McMahon Coach of the Year - Congratulations!

In particular, though I would like to thank retiring First XVIII coaches Richard Williams and John Clark. Rich and Clarky have been involved with the senior program for 3 and 4 years respectively. The senior coaching roles are like no other. To be competitive in the senior competition, the team needs to be taken to a whole new level. We have seen this over the last few years as the Club has built a professional program to allow us to compete with an undersized, under-aged squad (community clubs can field up to eight 19 year-olds) and achieve results. Senior coaching starts almost the minute the siren sounds for the last game of the current season. Pre-season plans are made and the conditioning program commences in November. Preseason in earnest gets underway in January. This is over nine months commitment to training, mentoring, social and team building activities and selection meetings.

I would sincerely like to thank Richard and John for their leadership and mentoring of the young men they have had in their charge over the last few years. The results on and off the field are a reflection of their dedication and commitment to the job.

As every coach will tell you, the success of every game day is a good manager – and we are fortunate enough to have so many of them. Many people do not realise how much work goes on behind the scenes to field a team each week. We are very grateful to all our managers for the role they play. In particular, I would like to thank Kylie Denny, new to the Committee in 2016, who took on the role of Managers' Coordinator with lots of efficiency and little fuss.

A big thank you too to all our First Aiders, boundary, and goal umpires, scorers, timekeepers and everyone else who keeps the team on the field!

Talent and Representative Programs and Awards

The GWS Talent Programs that are available to players from U12s upward are growing in their success and professionalism. This year, MAFC players were strongly represented at all ages, as evidenced in the 2016 representative players section of the yearbook.

In addition to this, a number of boys were selected to represent the ACT in the PSSA and SSSA competition in Maroochydore. Tom Green, Jordan Flavel, Joshua Green, Hunter Howden and Jude Henderson-Burch, were selected in the SSSA side with Tom Green named Captain. James Andric, Lachie Mertz, Nick Honeyman, Felix Henderson-Burch, and Charlie Mahar were selected in the PSSA side. Lachie Mertz and Felix Henderson-Birch were selected in Captains roles. James Elwin, Tom Highmore, Rhys Pollock, Ryan Crowley, Billy Clark, Max Beaumont, Luke Pailisi and Daniel Cerni were all part of the GWS U16- U18s Academy. Congratulations to Tom, Max and Daniel for going on to represent ACT/NSW.

This year, we were also well represented at the AFL Junior Presentation evening, with many of our players and a coach in line for awards.

Paul also mentors others, working with his assistants so they have the confidence to take control and manage the game. Another of Paul's great attributes is bringing coaching colleagues into the group and allowing them to contribute the knowledge of others to help make the boys better footballers.

Paul is a great example of the MAFC and College values and this was demonstrated when he noticed an on-field incident of great sportsmanship by an opposing player. Paul personally thanked the coach and player, and then he wrote to their Club. He also nominated this opposing player for a weekly AFL award, which the player was rightfully given.

Finally, one of the last reasons Paul was nominated for this award is all his own children have finished playing junior football, so he has no son in the team. For him to give all his time (with the great support from his wife, Christine) to coach a team he really has no connection with is very inspiring.

UNDER 12 COACHES' REPORT

Overall, it was a good year of development for the MAFC U12s. We started the year with a loss and, not having spent a lot of time together in the lead up to the opening round, we looked clunky and unsure.



In order to develop the boys, the team was split into three even

groups each game and each group rotated through the forwards, mids, and backs each quarter, with the players put into what I felt were their best positions for the last quarter.

While this tactic may have cost us some games along the way, the intent was to better prepare the boys to play in a range of positions as they get older and make MAFC a stronger club when the boys are senior players. In a similar vein, we introduced some basic concepts around team tactics, structure and the value of talk as a way of maintaining our structure. Along with structure and talk, the final piece of the team plan that was stressed was intensity: attack the ball on the ground, attack the ball in the air and, when the opposition has the ball, tackle.

In some respects, our best game of the season was a loss to the Belconnen Cats at the half way mark of the year. After losing to the Cats in the Grand Final last year, the boys played like men possessed, looking for revenge. They put the Cats under extreme pressure all day and lost to the Cats by 22 points, the closest any team had come to them up to that point in the year. After that game, I challenged the boys to maintain that level of intensity for the rest of the year. At the half way mark, we were 3 wins and 4 losses. In the last seven games of the year, we won 5, lost 1 and had one game washed out, a good indicator of our sustained intensity and improving ability to execute out game plan.

At the end of the regular season we finished sixth, meaning we would play the third placed Ainslie Red in an Elimination Final. In spite of the boys best efforts, they couldn't get over Ainslie in that game, losing by 11 points to the Reds, a team we lost to in round four by 44.

Although I haven't got the space here to mention everyone, I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the parents for their help. We had parent help with coaching, runners and trainers, scoring, field, boundary and goal umpires, player rotations and of course, the successful U12 trip to Melbourne, another highlight of the year.

Hopefully the boys have enjoyed their year, improved their footy, developed their love for the game and are looking forward to playing for MAFC again next year.

James Andric - James is a key position big man, who is the first choice ruckman for the U12s. One of the best overhead marks in the team. James was one of four MAFC

players to be chosen to represent the ACT at the 2016 Schoolboys AFL Carnival in Maroochydore, where he played one of his best games of the year at fullback, against a player bigger than his father. James' efforts this year have seen him stake a claim to being the best AFL player in his family.

Huon Apps - This was Huon's first year at Marist, but not his first year of playing AFL and it was obvious from his first game he would fit into the team well. An athletic key position tall, Huon looks best when he is one-on-one with his man, running into open space. While his father was an accomplished Rugby Union player, Huon has too much talent for Union, and so has chosen AFL to fully explore his potential. We look forward to Huon being a long term fixture at MAFC.

Matt Choules - Everyone loves Choulesy. Although I'd hate to be his school teacher, he's great to have in the team. Choulesy has made fullback his own this year, by using his man as a launching pad to run hard and straight at the footy and provide great rebound out of the backline for the team. He is seldom beaten and always provides a high standard of performance, weekin, week-out. I'm sure that's just what he's like in the classroom.

Liam Chynoweth - 'Chyna' is one of the fleet-footed little men of the team. He appears to have benefited from the coaches principle of rotating the players through the forwards, mids and backs every quarter, looking comfortable all around the ground and providing great flexibility for his coach. Probably his best game this year was combining across the wing with Cameron Cox where he helped provide the structure the coaching staff have been asking for.

Cameron Cox - Another one of the team's mosquito fleet, Coxy has been one of the big improvers through the course of the season. While there's nothing of him, and when the cold wind blows he's the first to start shivering, he won't be bowed in the contest. He has looked best this year playing across the wing where he's been able to display his capacity for hard running and contributed well to team structure.

Caden Egan - Caden missed the first part of the season thanks to one of his brothers breaking his arm, but the

rumour is he got even by breaking his brother's hand and forcing him to miss the U15s finals campaign (playing AFL is easy compared to life in the Egan house). When he did commence his season, he provided exactly the kind of attack on the footy the coach asks for every game. Another player who provides flexibility for the team by being equally adapt at shutting down a player in the backline or getting clearances through the middle.



Will Green - a tough year for Will,

having his Dad as coach. Not only does he have to spend more time with his Dad than he would like, but his old man likes to put him at centre-half back, and he'd prefer to play in the ruck. Because of his attack on the footy and the fact he's rarely beaten one-on-one, he and Choulesy have evolved into an effective pairing down back. They let their man take them to the ball, beat their man and then provide the rebound into the forward line.

Connor Harris - Connor is one of a group of players whose improvement during the year has been an important part of the improving fortunes of the team. While he has played well through the middle of the ground, in the latter part of the season he seemed to gain a taste for the goals, often seen drifting forward and snapping at goal from over his shoulder.

Felix Henderson—Burch - another stellar year for Felix. He has played consistently high quality football for Marist, was one of four boys from MAFC selected to represent the ACT at the 2016 Schoolboys AFL Carnival in Maroochydore and was chosen by his peers to be the ACT team Vice Captain at the carnival. Along the way, he has won the goal kicking award for the U12 competition and the best and fairest for the Marist U12s. His favourite position is in the mid-field, but he also enjoys going forward, where he finds space by swinging onto his left foot and taking a shot for goal.

Nick Honeyman - the third member of the Marist U12s to be chosen to represent the ACT at the 2016 Schoolboys AFL Carnival in Maroochydore. Like the others, he is a mid-fielder, but unlike the taller boys, he is a natural rover, using his clean hands and silky skills to provide "laces out" delivery to the forwards. Nick is another one who is unfortunate enough to have his old man on the coaching staff (assistant coach and team runner), but thankfully for him he can already out-run his father, so he manages to avoid the grumpy messages after he makes a mistake.

Harvey Jack - another member of the U12s to show strong improvement this year, Harvey has gone from playing in the pockets and flanks to filling key positions through the spine, including some time in the ruck. Part of his improvement can be put down to having his younger brother Kel come along to Sunday afternoon training at Pearce oval. There's definitely no love lost between the pair, with both Harvey and Kel saving their hardest tackles for each other during contested work.

Adam Mann - In spite of choosing to spend some of the colder weeks of the Canberra winter traveling around Europe, Adam has had a good year for the MAFC U12s. Preferring to play across the half forward line or even wing, Adam reads the pay well and seems to have picked up some of the concepts behind the team structure faster than most. We're looking forward to another good year from Adam next year.

Kian McAuliffe - If my memory serves me correctly, Kian kicked his first goal for MAFC late in the season, and got a liberal dousing from the boys water bottles after the game to celebrate. Kian's been a real utility for the team this year, filling just about every position from backs to forwards, always giving the team a good option wherever he plays. Being his first year at the school, we're looking forward to many more years of good footy from Kian.

UNDER 15 COACHES' REPORT

If you judge a season on wins and losses, you'd easily say we've had a great year. But judging junior sport on wins and losses is just one element and, to be frank, winning is not necessarily that important. Sometimes losing can be just as rewarding (as spoken by a Collingwood



supporter). So how do we judge the season gone by?

Well, firstly it started early with pre-season training. In the hot summer months, we regularly had more than a dozen boys at training - and these were days that climbed well past 30 degrees.
