PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The Marist Australian Football Club enjoyed another hugely successful season in 2022 – both on and off the pitch.

This season Marist fielded nine teams with two teams in the Under 13 competition and one team in all other age groups. Six teams played in finals – Under 11 and First XVIII (semi-finalists), Under 12 and Under 13 Sky (preliminary finalists) and Under 14 and Under 15 (grand finalists).

Our Under 15 team dominated the competition all season and were crowned premiers with a convincing 13.10 (88) to 3.5 (23) win over Weston Creek Wildcats. It was an awesome performance by our boys on a sunny but freezing cold afternoon at Footy Park. It's been a horrid two years and our Under 15 boys lifted the spirits of the whole club – it even felt like a win on behalf of boys who missed out on premiership glory when last season was cancelled. Congratulations to Steve Mahar and his team on a wonderful achievement including an undefeated season of footy.

We also celebrated many individual player achievements. Hugh Strickland and Will Green were both named in AFL Canberra's Rising Stars Team of the Year and multiple boys were selected in School Sport ACT and GWS Giants Academy and representative teams. Jude Leech (Under 11) and Alexander Maher (Under 12) were named AFL Canberra's league Best and Fairest.

Some club achievements during 2022, included:

- Implementing the new PlayHQ registration and game-day management system including online merchandise orders as part of player registration
- Launching a new and improved club website using the AFL's template club website
- Establishing a working group to commence planning for the club's 50th anniversary in 2023
- Celebrating Indigenous Round at Lindwall Oval including Acknowledgement of Country said in Ngunnawal language
- Our First XVIII wearing special playing socks to raise awareness of motor neurone disease and all teams wearing yellow socks for R U OK? Day
- Hosting semi-finals and preliminary finals matches at Lindwall Oval.

I would like to thank our coaches, assistant coaches, team managers and other volunteers for their efforts this season. I would also like to thank our Head of Sport, Paul Mead, my colleagues on the footy club committee and especially our College sports coordinator, Sarah Mahar. We are fortunate at Marist to offer many sports and it's only possible because of the contribution of our volunteers and College staff involved in the extracurricular programs.

Farewell and best wishes to our Year 12 players. You have been terrific role models for our younger boys, and you will be missed.

SHMMARY OF SEASON

For most boys, Under 10s marks the first year of their Marist football journey, and this was the case for all but 2 players. Within this group, several were new to the sport of Aussie Rules. With all of this in mind, there was a constant focus on fun, immersion, and the upholding of the Marist values, as taught in all Year 4 classes, in all training sessions and matches; respect and sportsmanship naturally became a focus for all 'Blue and Blue' players.

The U10 boys rotated throughout defence, the forward line and the midfield in order to get a taste of each position and develop a broad range of skills. Game rules were modified in order to nurture development and

allow for maximum participation. For example, only players in the forward zone could kick a goal. This, in turn, allowed for plenty of practise in the fundamentals of leading for the ball and forward entries. Another modified rule that resulted in an easy development focus was 'no kicking off the ground'. This, naturally, encouraged boys to put their head over the ball and always look for the best option when dishing the ball out.

All Under 10 players represented the College with immense pride, and although the boys didn't lose many games for the season, the focus always returned to fun and development (while still allowing the song to be belted out after a 'W').

PLAYER SUMMARIES

DANE BERTRAM

Dane showed immense courage and football 'smarts' all year, with countless follow-up tackles (often on players twice his size!), and clever 'in and under' plays, always supporting those around him.

RYDER BOERSIG

Ryder ran and tackled hard all year, growing in self-confidence as the season wore on. He played in front, never out of a contest, and showed great composure and skill by foot.

HENRY DENNY

Henry displayed leadership and sportsmanship in equal measure, and never shied away from a contest. He began to find his voice as the year went on, and was acknowledged with a coaches award.

LACHLAN EDWARDS

Lachlan, one of the recipients of the coaches award, showed a great eagerness to develop his game, and was a huge asset due to his thumping right foot, composure under pressure, and relentless forward and defensive pressure and courage.

LOUIE ELLIOTT

Louie showed tremendous improvement throughout the year, and proved to be one of our toughest contested players by season's end. It was great to see Louie's pure enjoyment of the game week-in, week-out.

HARVEY FILLBROOK

Harvey showed dash in all positions, and a lethal snap kick, picking up countless contested marks and impressive goals (despite being robbed of one, on the line, by his little brother!).

SHMMARY OF SEASON

The U11 boys had a fantastic season. Finishing 3rd on the ladder at the end of the home and away rounds, Marist lost a nail-biting elimination final by just 3 points to eventual premiers Queanbeyan.

It was difficult to know how the team would perform at the beginning of the season. We had an impressive 24 players on our list; ten boys up from U10s, seven remaining from last year's U11s, and seven who were playing footy for the first time. The boys blended in very well from the first training session and over the season implemented our game style better than we could have ever expected.

On the player development front, all boys experienced a variety of field positions and played a minimum of three-quarters every game. The idea was to fast-track player improvement through exposure to different roles. We think this paid off well and as a result we had impressive depth in all areas of the ground. ANTHONY APOSTOLAKIS

Anthony played in a variety of positions and looked most at home as a forward. He often caught our attention using his strength to win contests and find space. At times he was an important goal scorer and provider for the team.

Paddy found an excellent balance in his game this season. Strong in the contest, he always put his head over the ball and used release handball to great effect. In space he made good decisions and used the ball superbly.

SHMMARY OF SEASON

Jude was a top up player from u11s. He played a total of 8 games. He is an exceptional talent, he kicked 11 goals in his 8 games, a best of 4 goals in one game. Jude's attack on the footy in the ruck or marking contest or ground ball is fantastic to watch – gives his all.

Kai has been with us from the start, he has improved his attack at the footy and his kicking. A great contributor at training, he always listens to the coaches and he's keen to improve as he continues his AFL journey.

SUMMARY OF SEASON

SUMMARY OF SEASON

The Rising Stars (RS) season was probably the longest season of any Marist sporting team. Training commenced before school resumed in January, and the dedication and perseverance of every boy probably deserved better than the eventual fourth-placed finish we achieved. Nevertheless, the season had plenty of highlights and much for the boys to be proud of.

Pre-season training was open to all MAFC players, and the senior team were joined by many players from younger teams, which provided the seniors with a great experience of leadership and role-modelling. The number of compliments received from parents of these younger boys was testament to the fine way the older lads carried themselves.

Our regular pre-season trip to Wagga was another successful one, both on the field (where we gave Mater Dei College a touch up) and as a chance to get away together, and a win against Tuggeranong finished off our preparations. We were ready to go.

Midway through the season, after we had played all the other teams in the comp, we were on top, undefeated. Things were looking good. But there had been a few close wins – even lucky ones – so we were not getting ahead of ourselves. Irregular byes and washouts meant the remainder of the season was a bit fractured, and we found it hard to get back into a rhythm, and so dropped to 3rd by the time finals came along. Nevertheless, we were confident of the quality of our players and the soundness of our game plan.

On Elimination Final day, all the demons gathered together to conspire against us. Nothing went right: more scoring shots (including hitting the post with 60 seconds remaining), some unlucky umpiring decisions, our captain, Ned, on one leg, and when the siren



went, we had lost by 3 points. A tough way to finish a season that had started so optimistically. The boys were devastated as it sunk in for the Year 12s that this was the last time they would pull on the blue and blue.

I think it was particularly hard for the leadership group of Ned Korsten (c), Hugh Strickland (vc), Ryan Ellis, Will Green and Hugo Blacker. These guys had been elected by the team and took the weight on their shoulders with willingness and determination, but then put an extra weight of expectation on themselves, and felt the loss most keenly. They needn't feel at all guilty or responsible for the way the season ended: they led by example on the day and throughout the season, communicating effectively and appropriately with the coaches and the playing group. They were fine leaders.

The boys were a wonderful group to coach. They were mature about their footy, yet had fun and a close bond that made training and match days terrific experiences to be part of. At the start of the year, I had spoken to them about bringing their gifts to the team, no matter what level of skill or ability that entailed, and they all brought whatever they had, worked to improve it, and gave it to the team.

The boys had a tremendous crew supporting them throughout the season. Michael Strickland and Richard Green brought knowledge, experience, insight and positivity to the coaching group. Fr Peter Day was

the jack-of-all-trades: from running water, to moving cones, to just having a friendly word for every boy, he added immeasurably to the culture of the group. Michael Fitzgerald went about the managerial tasks and made sure all was in order for the team, whether it be socks or indigenous jumpers or jelly snakes after the game – when we needed it, it was there. Jono Beesley and Marty Robinson were the runners on game day. They were (literally) tireless and always had a positive message for the boys, despite what the coaches had told them to say! Greg Jenkins kept the boys strapped and healthy, managing the First Aid duties with reliability and understanding; ready with a quick, accurate diagnosis and a bag of ice. Lots of others chipped in, both on game days or in the background: special mentions to Geoff Davidson as MAFC President, who was always supportive and positive; Kylie Denny, MAFC Vice-President had every answer ready to my endless questions and requests; and to Sarah Mahar as college rep and Chris Maher as Director of Coaching were also never anything but supportive and helpful. And I always felt appreciated and supported by the parents and families of all the players.

For many, the RS team is an unusual one in that there's no "we'll come back better next year," since the Yr 12s (and their parents) move on. We hope they stay in touch with footy, finding a team somewhere, somehow, and continue to give to, and reap benefits from, the great game of Aussie Rules footy.

HUON APPS

Huon was always calm, composed and tough in the contest, often putting his body on the line between a high ball and leading opposition forwards. Very strong overhead, with a great ability to read the play, we could always count on him for at least a couple of intercept marks each game. A great team man and a leader in the backline all year.

TOM BEESLEY

Tom was superb for us this season. If there's an opposite to "the bigger they are the harder they fall," Tom was it. He was one of our most competitive players every week. He combined fierce attack on the ball with speed and a deadly left foot to continually give us drive from the wing. His strength overhead was a feature, and his reliable kicking for goal calmed and reassured the bench many times!

Mitch was a revelation. Our second ruck, he was probably undersized for the position, but, as the saying goes, it's not the size of the dog in the fight. Mitch's effort in every game was unquestioned and he continually beat taller and better-credentialed opponents. Every week he gave us a 100% effort which is all you can ask for as a coach.
